### Principal's News....

#### END OF TERM 2 - CLASSES FINISH TODAY

It is hard to believe that we are at the end of term. It has been very busy with an unexpected lock down. Mr Tactor is very proud of all the students during this term and the effort they have put into their learning. Mr Tactor would like to thank the staff who have continued to work very hard to support all students and families. Tomorrow Friday 25<sup>th</sup> June is a Student Free Day due to Parent Teacher Interviews.

#### BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS WORKS

During the holiday break, we will be having a number of jobs completed around the school. Asphalt will be replaced on the basketball court and along the side of the art room building to the gate. New kerbing and new line marking will be installed in these areas. Work will also begin in the outdoor classroom. The inside will be refurbished, there will be new sliding doors and window protection, the floor will be levelled with new concrete and work will be done on the fencing area of the garden. Some of these works will be completed during Term 3. We will also be having some painting completed in the main building. We received some exciting news yesterday that we have a \$50,000 grant to repair the roof of the walkway to the art room wing and the roof of that building. We will be beginning this process next term.

Thank you to Eleanor who will be finishing with us tomorrow. Eleanor has been fantastic in the office. We may see her again in the future on a relief basis.





## WELCOME MS STEWART


Thank you for the delicious Roary sweets. It was thoughtful of you. Our class loved them and one final thank you!

Did you know South St Primary School has two community outreach nurses to support our school community?



Read about everything we do!

Hello! We are your community outreach nurses at South St PS (usually known as school nurses). We provide support, advice and education to students while working within the school wellbeing team and alongside students, families and school staff. We provide a range of referrals to other services, and can help progress the student's treatment and care plan. The role of the school nurse is flexible, and aims to create a "one stop shop" for parents and families to access supports needed to better provide for your child's health, social, emotional and educational needs. School nursing involves primary health care, cultural competence, early detection and early intervention, health promotion, illness prevention, health education, chronic condition management, environmental health and safety, emergency/ crisis management, sports health, health counselling, service delivery and resource management.

As your school nurses, we are available to;

- Help students attend appointments with GPs and paediatricians
- Work with GPs and paediatricians to progress the child's follow-up care and treatment
- Make referrals to other relevant healthcare professionals (i.e. speech, OT, continence, dietician)
- Provide health and hygiene education
- Offer mental health support
- Help with hearing and vision screening
- Provide nutrition advice
- Help children learn how to look after their teeth and gums at home

If you would like to speak with us, we are at school on the following days, or please speak with the school on 5127 1512 about accessing our support; Mondays – Katelyn, Thursday and Friday – Ainsley


