On Monday the 22nd of November our children will be placed in groups to participate in indigenous activities; Language Bingo (Goomboonj), Biscuit decorating/Flags, Indigenous gardening and Dreamtime stories.

We are lucky enough to have a local Koori elder and some Koori education support officers join us for this day to support our cultural understanding of NAIDOC celebrations.

Here are the final details for our sleepover on Friday 19th November.

Due to Covid restrictions, there are some regulations we need to adhere to regarding drop off and picking up your child. Below is a rundown of the evening.

DROP OFF:

TIME—6PM

There is a set drop off point for each grade, please note the following:

Grade 2A - Drop off at Bealiba Road entrance,

Grade I/2B - South Street entry,

Grade 1/2C - the MELC small gate (accessed from South St).

Once there, you will be greeted by your child's teacher. Your child will then be accompanied by another staff member into the school building.

Once all children have arrived dinner will commence at 6:30pm which will be pizza (and alternatives for the non-pizza eaters). After dinner, we will watch a movie and snuggle down for a good night's sleep!

PICK UP

<u>TIME – 8AM</u>

On Saturday morning, children will be ready to be picked up from the various pick-up points as listed above.

Please ensure that you are at the pick-up points at 8am SHARP.
