### IMPORTANT THINGS:

Please remember to pack the following items for your child:

To receive a raffle ticket all your child needs to do is attend school for a whole week. If your child has an explained absence, they will still receive a raffle ticket.

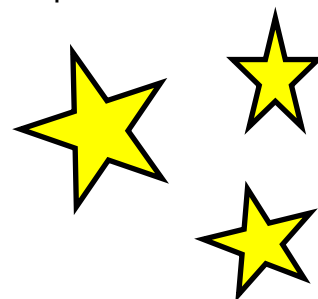
However, if it is unexplained unfortunately, they will not receive a raffle ticket for that week. We will draw the raffle on the last week of school. Good Luck to all!

Well done to everyone who went, it was a great day!





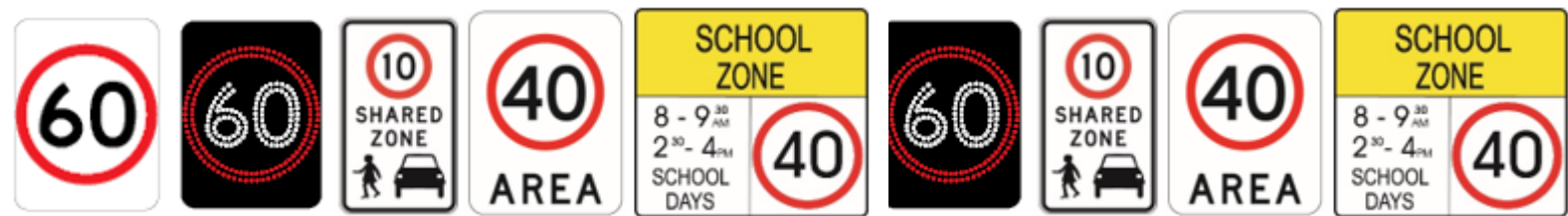


# Tennis

*Hello families,*

*Just a reminder that our car park has a speed limit of 20kms. We have had a report of reckless driving.*
