Students, teachers and support staff will travel by bus from South Street, departing around 9am. Sports equipment will be brought for games and free play. After a day at the park, and a picnic lunch, we will depart by 2.00pm to be back at school for parents to pick up as normal.

## **ASTHMA—Preparation is Key**

You may have noticed your child has been needing their asthma medication a bit more recently, or is complaining of itchy eyes, runny nose, cough, or itchy skin.

There are many triggers for these symptoms, but a common one is pollen in the air.

For those really feeling the effects of the pollen count this week, did you know you can check the ratings before leaving home or sending the kids to school?

Below is the link to the Melbourne website, but there is also an App you can download to track the pollen count each day. There is also a grass pollen station in Churchill to give you more local accurate information.

To help your child at school, please ensure they have any preventative medications for asthma allergies/hay fever before they leave home. For children with asthma, please ensure you send their medication to school so they have it handy if needed.

#### **SICKNESS**

To support our school being COVID safe it is important that you keep child/ren home when they have any cold and flu like symptoms.

We also encourage where appropriate that children presenting with COVID like symptoms get tested and stay home until a negative test is received and or all symptoms clear up.



### **ASTHMA PLANS**

For children diagnosed with Asthma, the school requires a current Asthma Plan so staff know what medication and care is required.

Over the school holidays, could you please see your doctor and have them complete an updated Asthma Plan to cover your child/children for the 2022 school year.

At the start of Term 1, please send this plan to school so our records are up to date.

An up to date Asthma Plan ensures staff can provide the best care for your child/children when they are at school, on excursions, or away on school camp.

All students are required in uniform with a broad brimmed/bucket hat ready to be sun smart from day 1.


### Update from Mr Tactor
