

2022 Asthma Plan Reminder

For children diagnosed with Asthma, the school requires a current Asthma Plan so staff know what medication and care is required. Could you please see your doctor and have them complete an updated Asthma Plan to cover your child/children for the 2022 school year?

Please send this plan to school as soon as you are able, so our records are up to date.

An up to date Asthma Plan ensures staff can provide the best care for your child/children when they are at school, on excursions, or away on school camp.

COVID Tests

Not sure what to do once your student has tested positive?

If a student receives a positive test result at any time, they (or their parents) must report this through the [Department of Health online system](#) or via the coronavirus hotline at [1800 675 398](#).

Students (or their parents) must also report a positive result to their school, either through the [Student COVID-19 Test Portal](#) or by phone or written notification; this is so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms.

A positive case can return to school after their isolation period end and displaying no illness symptoms.

Household or household-like contacts

- You have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation or care facility.
- You must quarantine for 7 days.
- You must get tested on Day 1 of quarantine (or as soon as possible) and get tested again on Day 6 of quarantine - with a rapid antigen test, or a PCR test if you can't access a rapid antigen test.

If you test positive on a rapid antigen test, you must report your result. Visit [Reporting your result](#) page for more information.

- Household or household-like contacts are also referred to as *close contacts*.

Camps 2022

Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund applications

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students. Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

It is important that funding made available in 2022 supports students to participate in school trips, camps and sporting activities this year rather than being held for future years. This funding can also be used in conjunction with any funding accrued from previous years.

Please note these activities will only take place if they meet COVIDSafe requirements.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 03 5127 1512 and ask for an application form.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

SAVE THE DATE - 2022 5/6 CAMP—SOVEREIGN HILL

We are really excited to announce that on 22nd – 25th November 2022 the grade 5/6 students will have the opportunity to attend Sovereign Hill Camp.

The camp will be a unique opportunity for students to experience life during the gold rush and understand how the event changed Victoria.

At this stage the approximate cost of the camp will be around **\$430 - \$480**.

Some families may have Camps, Sports and Excursions Funding available to them to use towards the camp.
