Important message

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we settle into the new school year I thought I'd take the opportunity to address some expectations around how we treat each other.

We all share responsibility for making our school a positive, respectful and safe environment for our students to learn and thrive. As adults, it's particularly important that we model positive behaviour for our students. I encourage everyone to take a moment to reflect on this and consider ways to model kindness and respect.

Seeing, hearing and dealing with negativity or anger can be extremely upsetting for both children and adults. The start of term is a good opportunity for us all to reflect on good practices. Please take the time to consider our *Statement of Values and School Philosophy* which is available on the school's website. Safety, Respect and Learning are key behaviours that we expect to see across all areas of our school.

Parents and carers are expected to communicate politely and respectfully with all members of the school community, including each other, and follow the schools processes for communicating complaints and concerns. Discrimination, harassment, bullying, violence, threatening, or aggressive behaviour are not acceptable at our school.

Communicating directly with or confronting another parent or child about concerns or perceived issues between children is not consistent with our school's expectations. While we understand every parent and carer's desire to advocate for their child, in our experience as educators, direct confrontations and accusations rarely accurately reflect the interactions and behaviour that we observe between students at school. On occasion, a parent or carer will raise concerns in an inappropriate or disrespectful way. Fortunately, such instances are rare and the overwhelming majority of you contribute to a supportive and respectful school community.

As our children grow, they learn valuable social skills that will help them for the rest of their lives. It is not uncommon for young children to navigate occasional negative interactions, hurt feelings and changing friendship groups at school. If you have concerns about your child, please communicate with their classroom teacher in the first instance.

Late last year the Department of Education and Training published its new Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy, which promotes the importance of respectful and collaborative relationships between parents, carers and school staff in order to build strong, healthy and thriving school communities. When a small number of parents and carers behave unacceptably towards a staff member or another member of the school community, this can affect their health, safety, and wellbeing. The impact can also be felt by the wider school community.

I look forward to another productive term ahead. Thank you all for partnering with us to support your children in their learning and in creating a positive and caring school community.

At the beginning of each year it is important to make sure the office have all of your details correct.



2022 Asthma Plan Reminder

For children diagnosed with Asthma, the school requires a current Asthma Plan so staff know what medication and care is required. Could you please see your doctor and have them complete an updated Asthma Plan to cover your child/children for the 2022 school year?

An up to date Asthma Plan ensures staff can provide the best care for your child/children when they are at school, on excursions, or away on school camp.

COVID Tests

Not sure what to do once your student has tested positive?

If a students receives a positive test result at any time, they (or their parents) must report this through the <u>Department of Health online system</u> or via the coronavirus hotline at <u>1800 675 398</u>.

Students (or their parents) must also report a positive result to their school, either through the <u>Student COVID-19 Test Portal</u> or by phone or written notification; this is so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms.

A positive case can return to school after their isolation period end and displaying no illness symptoms.

Not sure what this means for your house hold?

Household or household-like contacts

- You have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation or care facility.
- You must guarantine for 7 days.
- You must get tested on Day I of quarantine (or as soon as possible) and get tested again on Day 6 of quarantine with a rapid antigen test, or a PCR test if you can't access a rapid antigen test.

If you test positive on a rapid antigen test, you must report your result. Visit Reporting your result page for more information.

Household or household-like contacts are also referred to as close contacts.
