NAPLAN

(Term 2: 10th - 20th of May)

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the National Standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 are expected to participate in NAPLAN tests, and schools should not exert influence on parents or carers to withdraw their child from the tests. NAPLAN tests give you information on how your child is progressing against national standards. This information can be used to identify areas in which your child may benefit from additional assistance. NAPLAN does not replace, but rather complements assessments run by your child's classroom teacher throughout the year.

Some students who have been attending school in Australia for less than a year before the tests may be eligible for exemption. Exemptions should be discussed with your child's school.

Parents or carers may withdraw their child from the tests to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing. It is recommended that withdrawal be considered in consultation with your child's school. States and territories have different ways of managing student withdrawals, but formal notification must be received by the school principal prior to testing.

Wherever possible, schools will organise for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the test window.

Keep an eye on this section, as it will provide different information each week to keep you updated about NAPLAN leading into the testing window (Term 2: 10th – 20th of May)

COVID Tests

Not sure what to do once your student has tested positive?

If a students receives a positive test result at any time, they (or their parents) must report this through the <u>Department of Health online system</u> or via the coronavirus hotline at <u>1800 675 398</u>.

Students (or their parents) must also report a positive result to their school, either through the <u>Student COVID-19 Test Portal</u> or by phone or written notification; this is so the school can support them, record that they will be absent while in 7-day isolation, and let the rest of the school community know there has been a positive case onsite and that they should monitor for symptoms.

A positive case can return to school after their isolation period end and displaying no illness symptoms.

Not sure what this means for your house hold?

Household or household-like contacts

- You have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation or care facility.
- You must quarantine for 7 days.
- You must get tested on Day I of quarantine (or as soon as possible) and get tested again on Day 6 of quarantine with a rapid antigen test, or a PCR test if you can't access a rapid antigen test.

If you test positive on a rapid antigen test, you must report your result. Visit Reporting your result page for more information.

Household or household-like contacts are also referred to as close contacts.

Monday, recess time.


