Churchill Primary School

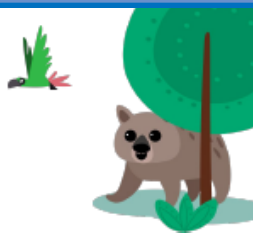
Where: Coleman Parade, Churchill
