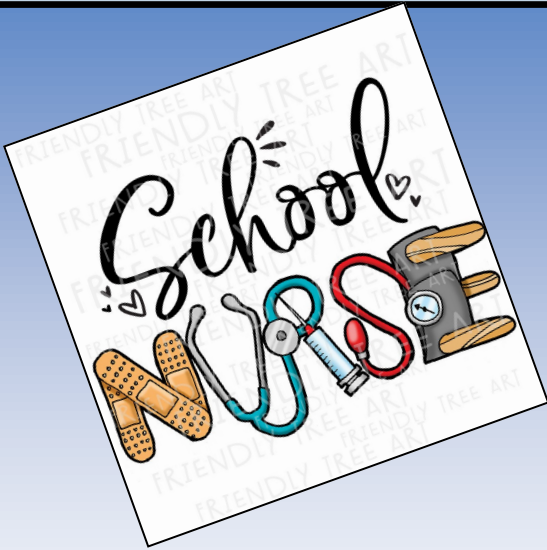


A huge thankyou to the Moe Lion's Club for the donation of books that we received on Friday.

FREE Sound Scouts hearing tests at South St Primary!

What? Sound Scouts is a fun App where kids play a game (while having their hearing checked) on an iPad/tablet using a set of headphones while we supervise. A report will be automatically generated following the test which I can send to parents/carers via email if required

When? Hearing tests will begin from next week and continue over the next month or so at school

Who? We will be conducting hearing tests for
Grade 2 and Grade 4 kids only

Why? Any hearing test results where a concern is identified, may indicate a referral to Gippsland Audiology for further testing.

We will contact parents/carers if a referral is required. Hearing tests are encouraged due to the importance of early intervention of hearing issues. Optimal educational outcomes are dependent on good hearing!

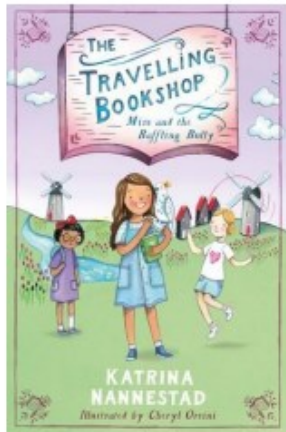

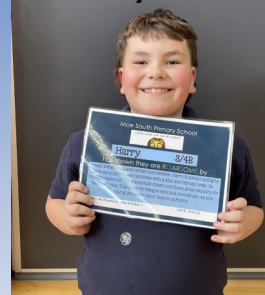

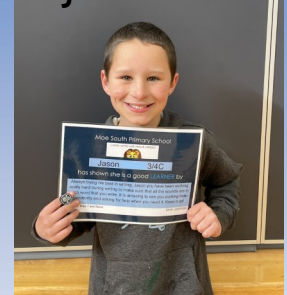
