As we near the end of one school year, our school-wide transition programs become an important priority across our school, as does the placement of students into grades.

Our Class Placement policy recently endorsed and approved by our School Council Policy Sub-Committee, details how our school community manages requests for class placements for the following school year, including requests for placement with friends or certain teachers. In line with our Class Placement Policy, we are unable to accommodate or consider any class placement requests.

However, when placing students into classes, our staff consider several factors, one of which is whom they would like to be placed with. Students across the school are currently asking students to nominate five peers they would like to work and learn with next year.

The carols will be held on the main stage 7.00pm – 9pm followed by a Firework display.






Get your littlies involved at entry level cricket with Woolworths Blast Cricket.
