News from our Principal....





I wanted to begin by thanking our camping staff for their work and dedication over these past four days as they have supported the Grade 5/6 students enjoy everything the area of Beechworth offers. It has been great to hear daily reports of the students enjoying themselves and enacting our values of Being Safe, Being Respectful and Being a Learner, I'm sure we will welcome back some happy yet exhausted campers on Friday afternoon. As we near the end of one school year, our school-wide transition programs become an important priority across our school. This year, our leadership team has reflected and revised our transition process to ensure that we continually improve the transition experience of all students as they move from one grade level to another, from kindergarten to primary school and from primary school to secondary school.

These processes are supported by our teaching and educational support staff, who are dedicated to ensuring these opportunities are successful for all students. Our staff prepare detailed information about student wellbeing, engagement and achievement and document this using class placement software, which along with student preferences of friends and peers they would like to be with and the expert knowledge of our staff, supports the development of classes.

At South Street Primary School we grow people who:

Are creative, curious and independent learners. Are resilient and problem solve when faced with challenges. Respect and care about themselves, each other and the world in which we live.

Our internal transition program consists of the following:

1st Transition Session – on the afternoon of Tuesday, the 29th of November, where teachers will take grades for two 30-minute sessions to establish connections, strengthen relationships and observe students interacting with each other.

Team and Leadership meetings occur where feedback on class dynamics, student friendships, and gender balance are considered with revisions made.

2nd Transition Session – on the afternoon of Tuesday, the 6th of December, where teachers will take revised class grades for another two 30-minute sessions to establish connections, strengthen relationships and observe students interacting with each other.

Team and Leadership meetings occur to finalise grade placements.


Statewide Transition Day - Tuesday the 13th of December - students will spend time with their 2023 teacher and classmates, in their 2023 classroom.



News from our Assistant Principal



Last Friday our staff continued our work on creating Positive Play at South Street Primary School. We focused our attention to Proactive and Active Play and the benefits of two 30 minute 'Play times'. Supporting student social skill development and providing alternative opportunities for play during recess and lunch are pivotal to setting all students up to be successful at school.

Proactive and Active Play provide opportunities for our students to develop a range of pro-social skills, conflict resolution and teamwork. We worked to refine our focus of Proactive and Active Play which included how we can resource these opportunities to accommodate for all students. This included feedback on our current processes and looking into the future to see where we can continue to improve.

As we continue to work in this space, we will develop strategies to support ALL students and accommodate for the vast range of interests our students have. With the change to our lunch time, we can have more adults interacting in the playground with students, this means more games, more sports, and more activities that our students can access.

An important part to our continued school improvement is linking our Positive Behaviour 4 Learning (PB4L), Behaviour Management and Playground process and supports so that we can create consistency across our school. At South Street we will continue to promote our school values, we will all Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner.

Keep an eye out for updates on our Proactive play, Active play, and Playground improvements in Term 4 and into 2023.




Get your littlies involved at entry level cricket with Woolworths Blast Cricket.
