Proactive play

is in our Play pit area near our Digitech room and focuses on supporting students to interact positively with others, follow rules of games, share, and learn together.





Active play

is an opportunity for students to play I structured games with staff out in the I playground. This may mean basketball, I Dodgeball, Table tennis and other team games.

Our staff work closely with students to help them develop their ability to cooperate, play fair and follow the rules of the game.

Positive Play Process



Solution Spot

Individual programs are sometimes needed for students who need extra support in the playground OR that cannot access the playground for a range of reason. An example of this is a student who may have hurt themselves (broken leg, arm etc) and will need a modified play program to ensure they are safe.

Solution Spot

is a place that staff will engage in positive conversations with our students to ensure we can effectively solve any issues that may arise in the playground.

At Solution Spot, all students have the opportunity to be heard and will be supported to solve problems and develop plans for improvement and future success.

Swimming Carnival

Our Annual School Swimming carnival is fast approaching and will be held on **Monday February 13th at the Moe Outdoor Pool.**

On Monday morning, after the bell, selected students will go down to Moe Swimming Pool to compete in formal swimming events to try out for the upcoming Western Valley District Swimming Carnival.

Then at 11:30am the rest of the school will walk over and meet them for a day of fun at the pool.

All students will then start walking back to school from 2:30pm for a normal pick-up time.

If you are concerned about your child's swimming abilities please notify the class teacher.

Wear:

Students are to wear a tee-shirt in house colours (NO SLEEVELESS TOPS), bathers, hat, sunscreen and shoes. In case of cold/wet weather, a jumper and raincoat.

Bring:

Students are required to bring a cut lunch and nutritious snacks in a clearly labeled container and a drink bottle.

(The canteen will NOT be open), a towel and sunscreen.

Families Welcome:

We welcome any parents to come and watch their child compete and to assist in any way possible. (timekeeping, results tracking, extra supervision)

Order envelopes must be returned to the school by Thursday the 16th of February.





Assistance for families continues to be available with food hampers, Food pantry, recycled uniform sales.



News from the Nurse



The Community Health Nurse in Primary Schools Program is a free service offered to students by Latrobe Community Health Service (LCHS) at Moe South Street Primary School. Katelyn Somerville and Ainsley James will be available on Mondays, Thursdays & Fridays during school terms, assisting students and the school community with health support, and linking students and caregivers to other health services.

They provide support, advice and education to students while working within the school wellbeing team and alongside students, families and school staff. They can provide a range of referrals to other services, and can help progress your child's treatment and care plan. The role of the school nurse is flexible, and aims to create a "one stop shop" for parents and families to access supports needed to better provide for a child's health, social, emotional and educational needs. The Community Health Nurse in Primary Schools program provides services and support including (but not limited to):

- Helping students attend appointments with GPs and paediatricians
- Working with GPs and paediatricians to progress the child's follow-up care and treatment
- Providing health and hygiene education Offering mental health support Helping with hearing and vision screening Providing nutrition advice Helping children learn how to look after their teeth and gums at home

Please reach out if you require any further information about any services we could provide you and your family.

ASTHMA ACTION PLAN what to look out for

Do we have your child's latest Asthma Action Plan for 2023? Late last year letters were sent home along with a blank Asthma Action Plan to families with children diagnosed with Asthma, requesting an updated plan be sent to school for the 2023 school year. The Department of Education requires all schools to have updated Asthma Action Plans every school year for students with asthma, so we can provide the correct management and support if needed.

Thank you to those families who have already returned their child's updated plan for the 2023 school year. If you haven't returned your child's 2023 Asthma Action Plan, could you please send to school ASAP? Please also ensure the current plan is dated 2023 and that it doesn't expire until 2024. We really appreciate your support as you will be helping us provide a safe environment for your child while at school. 
