What a fabulous turnout last night for our Games on the Lawn afternoon. Our staff were extremely excited to welcome and meet our parents and school community.



There are also more structured opportunities for parents to engage and interact with our school – these are provided through our Term 1 and Term 3 Parent Teacher Student Interviews and Term 2 and Term 4 written reports.

Based on the positive feedback and success of our Parent Teacher Interviews, these will again happen at the end of Terms 1 and 3.

Our School Council recently endorsed this approach, utilising the evening of the second last day and the last day to provide times for families to come in and discuss their child's learning with the teacher.

In 2023, parents will book appointment times online via Compass. The dates for our Term 1 Parent Teacher Interviews will be Wednesday the 5th of April, 3:00pm – 6:00pm and Thursday the 6th of April, 8:30am – 1:30pm

It is important to note that, as in previous years, students will only be required to attend on the last day for their interview only. There will be no classes running.

More details on how to book an appointment will be released closer to the date, however, we thought it would be important to communicate these arrangements well in advance so that you can make the necessary arrangements.



Our staff have worked incredibly hard since the beginning of the term in setting up and establishing routines and expectations that allow academic growth and achievement to occur. You may have even seen this in action as students were recognised by earning tokens for following our school values of being safe, respectful learners.

You will also have noticed that over the last few editions of Snippets, we have spent time Introducing our consistent approach to student behaviour management for our school community. We have also been completing similar sessions with our students.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSION FUND (CSEF)



The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, such as a Veterans Affairs Gold Card, Centrelink Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. There is also a special consideration category for asylum seeker and refugee families.

Payment amounts this year are \$125 for eligible primary school students.

Payments are made direct to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions and sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for *CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to*complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your
family circumstances including a new student enrolling with us.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 03 5127 1512 and ask for an application form.

You can also download the form, and find out more about the program and eligibility, on the Department of Education and Training's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund web page.

Check with the school office if you are unsure, and please return completed forms to the school office as soon as possible.

News from the School Nurse

Hearing Awareness Week 27 Feb - 3 March and World Hearing Day 3 March

This year the World Health Organisation is amplifying the message

"Ear and Hearing Care for All!

Highlighting the fact that primary health care (doctors/community health nurses) can address over 60% of the need for ear and hearing care <u>services</u>

Middle ear problems make up the majority of hearing issues experienced by school students. A visit to the doctor can help address these issues, either on the spot, with medication / treatment or by providing a referral to an Ear, Nose & Throat Specialist.

To ensure every child gets the support they need Sound Scouts recommend:

- screening all children to pick up undetected hearing issues
- liaising with parents/carers whose children have not passed the test and encourage them to read the Sound Scouts Report, and follow the recommendations

How to keep your ears healthy

Follow these simple tips from the World Health Organisation:

- DO use earplugs in noisy places
- DO check your hearing regularly (we recommend Sound Scouts
- DO wear your hearing aids regularly, as advised
- DO see a doctor if you have ear or hearing problems
- DON'T put cotton buds, oil, sticks or pins inside your ears
- DON'T swim or wash in dirty water
- DON'T share earphones or earplugs
- DON'T listen to loud sounds or loud music



At South Street Primary School, all Grade 2 and Grade 4 students will have their hearing screened using Sound Scouts by school nurses Ainsley and Katelyn (more info to come regarding dates, in future newsletters and Compass) @
