As a staff, this is exactly what we have done this past week. I have included a snapshot of our reflections and celebrations for you to read and share in our staff's daily excitement and passion for making a difference.

- Student's attitudes towards and engagement with our NAPLAN assessments. We had a strong participation in NAPLAN in both Grades 3 and 5
- Building a classroom culture that I am proud of (kindness, safety, strong relationships, transitions and routines)
- Setting up a classroom environment that is calm and focused. We have a good culture of students working together with a focus on learning
- I have supported a student to be ready for learning by working closely with the family to reduce anxiety about coming to school
- We have had excellent depth in our discussions during reading lessons. There have been great conversations about the text, and students have been building on their thinking and responses to comprehension questions
- The staff have been welcoming and friendly there are always positive interactions and greetings amongst staff in the morning
- There are high expectations for students (and staff) and an increase in accountability for their learning and behaviour
- We had a successful planning day (a team of teachers coming together to prepare for the term ahead) it was
 productive and professional!

I will finish with this reflection, which sums up the environment we are building here at South Street...

It has been a fabulous start to the year, and it is wonderful to be a part of such a cohesive and positive team. We all believe in shared goals that support and lead to academic success, and a positive school culture has resulted in happy, enthusiastic, and productive students and staff.

I trust that as a parent or guardian within our school community, you, too, have appreciated our staff's positive attitude and professionalism. I also hope that you enjoyed the chance to sit down and share the positives with your child's teacher this week as part of our Parent Teacher Student meetings and approach to reporting.

After all, there is so much to celebrate in a short amount of time. Our school community should be incredibly proud of the professional approach and the culture of continuous improvement at South Street.

On behalf of our team, I would like to wish all of our school community a safe and happy Easter break. Take care over the holiday period, and we look forward to seeing everyone again on Monday, the 24th of April.


Canteen News
