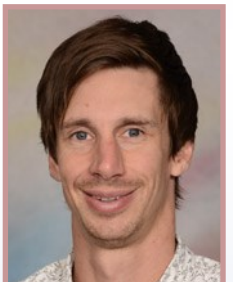

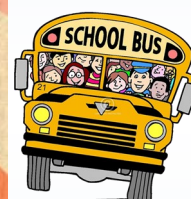

School Reports



Positive relationships and high expectations are the key at South Street Primary School. It is important that these positive relationships exist between all members of the school community.

Strong communication is also vital, ensuring that the partnerships that exist between families and the school are positive and meaningful. This philosophy forms the basis of reporting on student achievement at South Street Primary School.

At South Street Primary School, assessment and reporting procedures are consistent with the guidelines outlined by the Department of Education. The purpose of semester reports is to demonstrate to families, students, and teachers:

- The amount of learning growth the student has achieved over the last 6 to 12 months, using the Victorian Curriculum standard 5-point scale.
