Morning Routine Positive Primer



Here are a couple more Positive Primers to try out on the family at home. Don't forget that Positive Primers are like scuffing the surface of the student's brain so that the learning sticks. Positive Primers can involve a small movement, oral, thinking, or creative task designed to encourage the flow of positive emotions before the learning commences. Have a go at these two.

Whole-Body Rock, Paper, Scissors

Instead of using our hands we are going to use our whole bodies to play

Rock: Scrunch yourself into ball

Paper: Stretch out your body as straight as possible, with your arms above your heads

Scissors: Legs spread and arms opening and closing

Remembrance Day

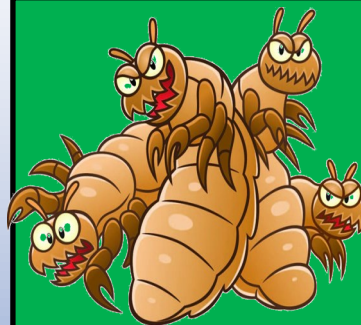
Remembrance Day was observed on Saturday the 11th November.

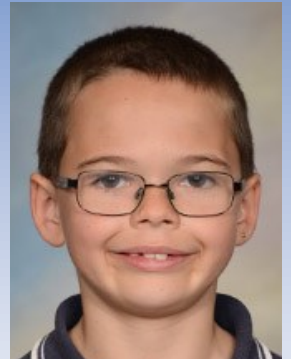

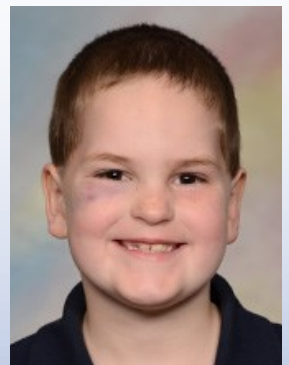
