As we near the end of one school year, our school-wide transition programs become an important priority across our school, as does the placement of students into grades.

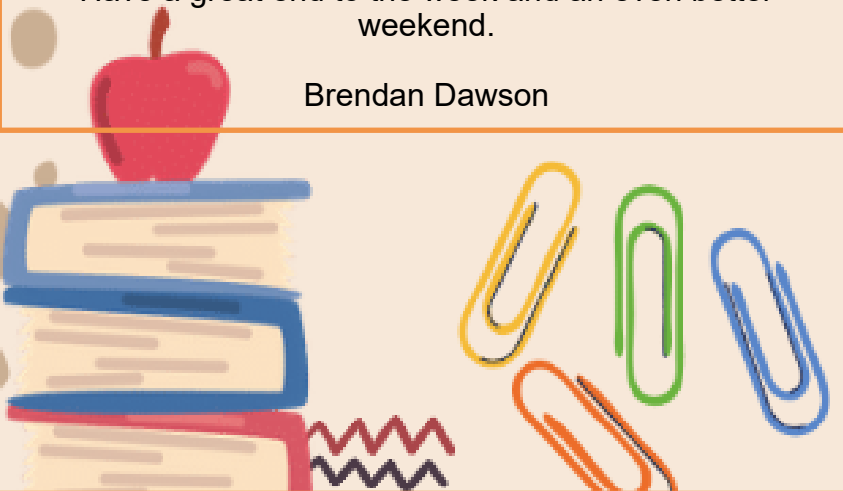

- Person 1 - "Three"

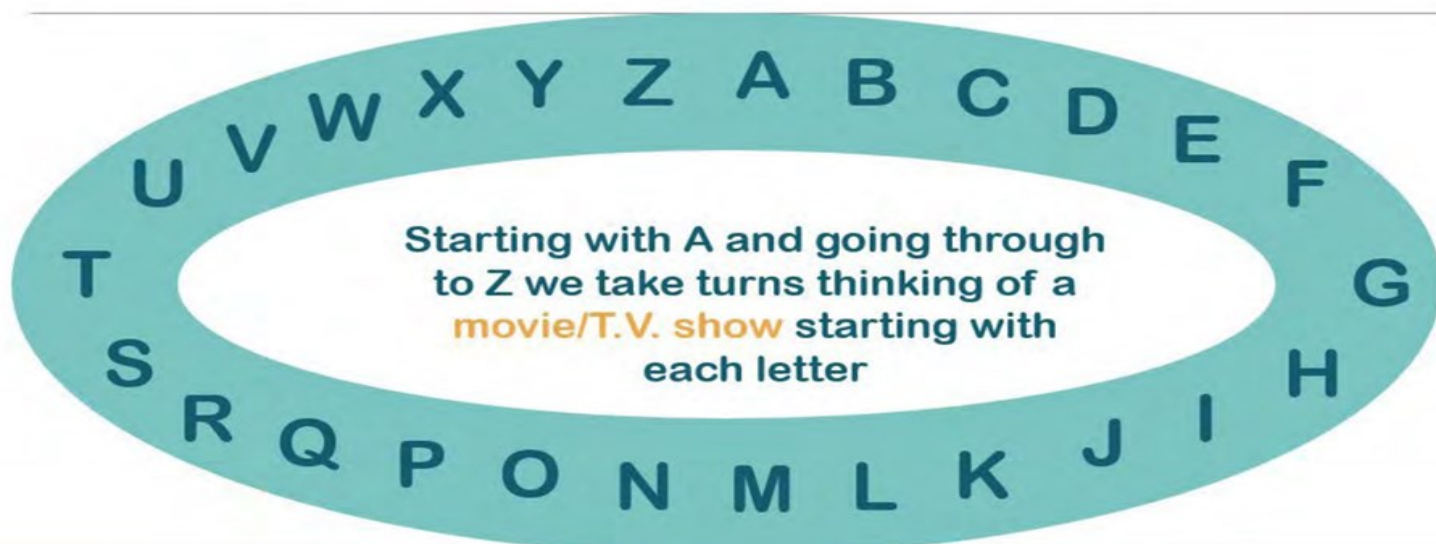
And just keep it going back and forth!

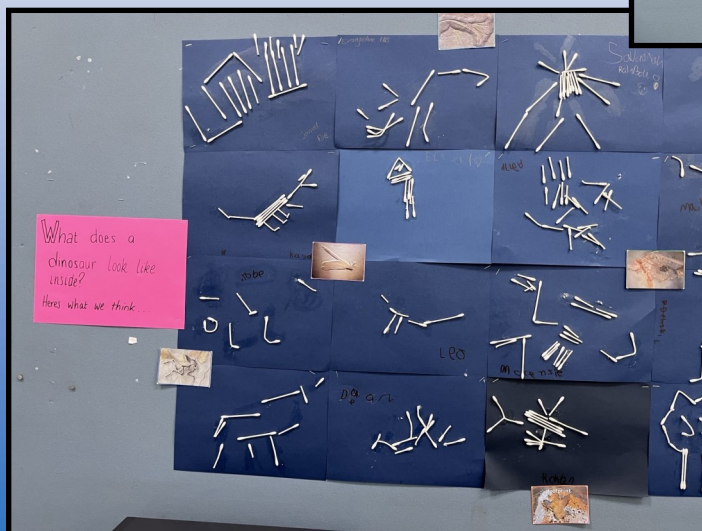
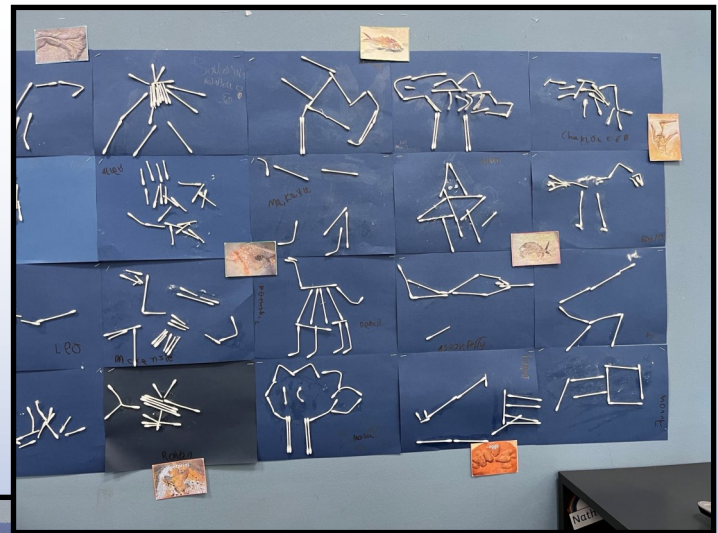

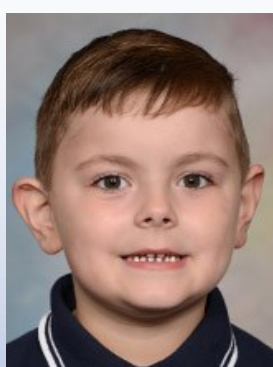
