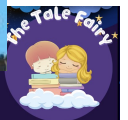
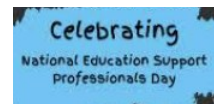

# Real Schools

## Class Support with Daniel Vella

As a part of our 3 year partnership with Reals School we had our first in school support day to work on the initial parts of the Real Schools Model – RP2.0.

Daniel worked in classrooms across our school modelling, co teaching and discussing effective engagement, teaching and learning strategies linked to the Real Schools model.

To complete a fantastic day Daniel then ran an information sessions for our families where he focused on 'Building a Restorative School Community'.

When asked what our families wanted for their kids from SSPS we heard the following:

***“I want my kids to be well supported and have a good sense of self worth”***

***“To become self learners and have opportunities to achieve”***

***“Have teachers that are present and engaged”***

Daniel spoke about how Real Schools works closely with our community to build culture. A word that he defined as “The collective noun for the behaviours we see in our school”. This begins with the language that we use and shared some strategies for the effective use of Affective Language and Affective interactions. This is when we see a behaviour that we accept (or some times don't) and we are able to communicate with our student by attaching an emotion to what we are seeing. Eg. “I am really proud of how you entered our classroom”

This allows students to be really clear with what we want to see from them and makes the students, and us as adults, feel good and have positive interactions. These interaction are then strongly focused on the future and constant improvement and development.

The final part of the night was focused on a strategy known as P3|P3|F3 and we use this to help us solve problems, particularly when there are multiple people involved.

P3|P3|F3 stands for Past 3 minutes | Present 3 minutes | Future 3 minutes.

As a team we start with the past OR what happened, this is an opportunity to label the behaviours, we don't name names or point fingers, we just share what behaviours we saw or did.

We then focus on the present – how are you feeling?

Future is then a commitment or plan to ensure that we can fix what we have done, or plan to be able to make better and clearer decisions next time.

You will hear your children begin to use this language and speak of these interactions as we continue to implement the Real Schools strategies.

It is an exciting partnership for our school and we will continue to communicate development through Snippets as the year goes on.

# Community News



## Building a national picture of child health

**From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).**

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities, and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

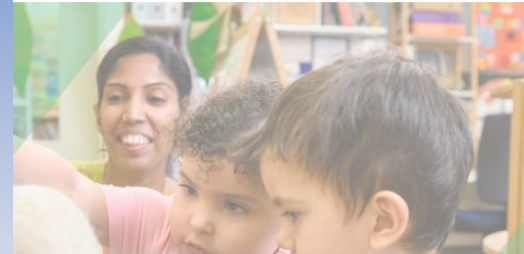
AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool.

Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs.

Participation in the AEDC is voluntary, however the AEDC relies on all schools with children in their first year of full-time school participating in the collection. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.
